Congratulations!

2020 was historic—a challenging year for our community and each of us as individuals. So, we are proud to celebrate the work produced by Marymount Manhattan College students and faculty from that period. With record-breaking submissions, nearly a hundred students offering up outstanding efforts of research and creativity produced under wildly adverse circumstances, the works honored here provide testimony to the resilience of the academy, where we channel energy towards learning and growth even when the soil feels rocky and the sun doesn't shine. A year later it's spring; the sun is returning and student work manifests our hopes for the future.

Our celebration takes a new form this year—the 44th Annual Honors Day Colloquium has gone *virtual*—and the Committee would like to draw your attention to two specific changes, intended to maximize our experience and offer students flexibility in participation, given the circumstances.

First, instead of individual students presenting in individual (Zoom) rooms, this year we've organized participants into presentation panels focused on a theme. When the Committee reads submissions, it becomes very clear that there are areas of interest shared by students across the college—problems their work intends to solve aligned with MMC's mission to "develop an awareness of social, political, cultural, and ethical issues in the belief that this awareness will lead to concern for, participation in, and improvement of society." Our honorees pored over the environment and questions of equity, they thought about how creativity and commerce connect or clash, they examined the world and its colonial legacies, they interrogated the identities that make us who we are, and the biology underpinning our bodies. To encourage us to see the ways this work manifests across the college, we have panels of scientists and sociologists, of artists and activists. May these cross-disciplinary panels remind us that no matter our program, we are all here at MMC as creative problem-solvers. Sparks may come from the places you least expect.

Second, the Honors Day Committee offered our honorees a choice of three modes of participation this year: students could participate live on Honors Day, they could have their project hosted on our new Honors Day website, or they could do both. Accordingly, while the program following is organized by time for students who chose to participate on Honors Day live, throughout you will see hyperlinks to kindred student work hosted on the Honors Day website (some of the live panelists' work is hyperlinked as well.) We wish to honor, acknowledge, and highlight all our students' projects, on every platform.
